COMPANY BIOS

ERIC VIGNER (Director) The driving force behind Vigner's theatrical approach is neither ideological, nor analytical, it is poetic. His direction acts as a luminating force shielding light on these significant writings. Eric Vigner develops a theater that questions the world, its frontiers between the people and has directed many contemporary playwrights such as Marguerite Duras' Savannah Bay at the Comédie-Française in Paris (2002) as well as at Espace Go in Montreal (2007). The Beast in the Jungle at the Kennedy Center in Washington (2004), and Pluie d'été à Hiroshima (2006) for the 60th Avignon Festival. Vigner develops a new approach of the French classics as well: he directed Racine's Bajazet (Comédie-Française, 1995), Molière's Ecole des Femmes (Comédie-Française, 1999), to name a few. He develops international collaborations, searching for a genuine mutual cultural transmission: Molière's and Lully's comedy-ballet The Bourgeois Gentleman for the National Theater of Korea in Seoul in 2004; Beaumarchais' The Barber of Seville with the actors of the National Theater of Albania in 2007.

ISMA'IL IBN CONNER (The Dealer, Translator) has been awarded a stageplay translation residency in Villeneuve-lez-Avignon, (France) at La Chartreuse - Centre National des écritures du spectacle for 2008. The basis of this residency is to continue translation work on Dans la Solitude des Champs de Coton (In the Solitude of Cotton Fields) and begin work on Les Jours des Meurtres (Koltès' version of Hamlet). Isma'il also performed a sneak preview/staged reading of his translation, In the Solitude of Cotton Fields at the 2007 TCG Conference for The Global Tapas program in Minneapolis, Minn. Other projects include Black Battles With Dogs (BBWD) directed by Arthur Nauzyciel at the Festival d'Avignon, France and the Hellenic Festival in Athens, Greece. BBWD debuted at 7 Stages in 2001 and subsequently toured France (Lorient, Créteil, and Clermont-Ferrand). BBWD was in Chicago for the "Playing French Festival" at the Athenaeum. Isma'il reprises his role as Alboury in BBWD in May 2008 in Orléans, France at the Centre Dramatique National, and Anvers. Belgium in January 2009. Isma'il is an Artistic Associate with 7 Stages Theatre and creator of 7 Stages' resident artist ensemble Group 7 (G7).

DEL HAMILTON (The Client) As co-founder of 7 Stages, Del has been a part of the company since its inception in 1979. As Artistic Director, he has directed over 50 productions at 7 Stages, including HUSH: Composing Blind Tom Wiggins and Come on in My Kitchen by Robert Earl Price, Athol Fugard's My Children! My Africa! and Master Harold...and the Boys, Susan Yankowitz's Night Sky, and numerous plays by Sam Shepard. He has also acted in such notable plays as Beckett's Waiting for Godot, Moliere's The Miser, Carmen Kittel by George Seidel, Der Park by Botho Strauss, Fugard's A Place With the Pigs, Bernard-Marie Koltes' Black Battles with Dogs, and the original production of Jim Grimsley's Mr. Universe. Del directed a very successful production of One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest at Teatr Nowy in Poznan, Poland, and he has acted and directed at theaters in Atlanta, New York, London, Paris, Lorient, Belgrade and Amsterdam. Del is the author of several plays and has received numerous awards.

COMPANY CYRIL BRODY (Assistant Director) has worked with director Eric Vigner for several years, beginning with Debrayage by Remi BIOS De Vos in Switzerland which subsequently was shown at CDDB in Lorient. An independent film director, Cyril has written and directed Le Souci and En Service, a film which won a Jury's special prize in Brive, France 2007. Currently he is working with Sylvie Encrive on a new piece titled *A moi-meme pour plus tard*. His feature film, Les Petites vacances, was written for Olivier Peyon and has been at many independent film festivals since 2006.

> PASCAL NOËL (Lighting Design) began his professional lighting design with stage director Jérôme Savary at the Opéra Comique in Paris after graduate studies in math and physics. In 1999, he undertook the lighting for Sotigui Kouyaté's productions at several major national theaters including the Théâtre de Chatelet, the Théâtre des Bouffes du Nord and the Théâtre des Amandiers. Pascal regularly works with director Eric Vigner, lighting his productions of Beaumarchais' Barber of Seville and the contemporary playwright Remi de Vox' Debrayage. Other directors for whom Pascal has designed the lighting include Antoine Bourseiller, Nicolas Briançon, Nanou Garcia, Claude Confortès, Jacque Coutureau and Daniel Mermet. Pascal's expertise also extends to the realm of dance. He created the lighting for Sylvie Guillem's Gisèle at the Scala in Milan and the Royal Opéra House in London and for choreographer Olivier Chanut's creations at the Opera du Rhin and the Théâtre de l'Octogone.

> OTHELLO VILGARD (Sound Design) is a film maker and a photographer. He teaches experimental cinema at the University of Paris X-Nanterre. He is also in charge of Etna, a structure dedicated to experimental cinema, and takes part to a number of events related to this discipline (symposiums, conferences, festivals, etc.). Most of the experimental movies he has directed (such as *High, Lightning* and *Terrae*) are rhythmic compositions made of restricted visual elements. Since he met French stage director Eric Vigner in 2004, he has started working for theater and was associated to the director's artistic work. He has directed films from Savannah Bay and Pluie d'été à Hiroshima by Marquerite Duras and Où boivent les vaches by Roland Dubillard. He has been in charge of sound design for Eric Vigner's last creations including *Jusqu'à* ce que la mort nous sépare (performed at Théâtre du Rond-Point, Paris) and *Débrayage* by Remi De Vos. He has been an associated artist to CDDB-Théâtre de Lorient since 2006.

A five week theatre training program for teens July 7 - August 10, 2008, weekdays 10am - 5pm





ISMA'IL IBN CONNER (The Dealer, Translator) has been awarded a stageplay translation residency in Villeneuve-lez-Avignon, (France) at La Chartreuse - Centre National des écritures du spectacle for 2008. The basis of this residency is to continue translation work on Dans la Solitude des Champs de Coton (In the Solitude of Cotton Fields) and begin work on Les Jours des Meurtres (Koltès' version of Hamlet). Isma'il also performed a sneak preview/staged reading of his translation, In the Solitude of Cotton Fields at the 2007 TCG Conference for The Global Tapas program in Minneapolis, Minn. Other projects include Black Battles With Dogs (BBWD) directed by Arthur Nauzyciel at the Festival d'Avignon, France and the Hellenic Festival in Athens, Greece. BBWD debuted at 7 Stages in 2001 and subsequently toured France (Lorient, Créteil, and Clermont-Ferrand). BBWD

was in Chicago for the "Playing French Festival" at the Athenaeum. Isma il reprises his role as Alboury in *BBWD* in May 2008 in Orléans, France at the Centre Dramatique National, and Anvers,

ERIC VIGNER (Director) The driving force behind Vigner's theatrical approach is neither ideological, nor analytical, it is poetic.

His direction acts as a luminating force shielding light on these significant writings. Eric Vigner develops a theater that questions the world, its frontiers between the people and has directed many

contemporary playwrights such as Marguerite Duras' Savannah Bay at the Comédie-Française in Paris (2002) as well as at Espace Go in Montreal (2007), The Beast in the Jungle at the Ken-

nedy Center in Washington (2004), and *Pluie d'été à Hiroshima* (2006) for the 60th Avignon Festival. Vigner develops a new ap-

DEL HAMILTON (The Client) As co-founder of 7 Stages, Del has been a part of the company since its inception in 1979. As Artistic Director, he has directed over 50 productions at 7 Stages, including HUSH: Composing Blind Tom Wiggins and Come on in My Kitchen by Robert Earl Price, Athol Fugard's My Children! My Africa! and Master Harold...and the Boys, Susan Yankowitz's Night Sky, and numerous plays by Sam Shepard. He has also acted in such notable plays as Beckett's Waiting for Godot, Moliere's The Miser, Carmen Kittel by George Seidel, Der Park by Botho Strauss, Fugard's A Place With the Pigs, Bernard-Marie Koltes' Black Battles with Dogs, and the original production of Jim Grimsley's Mr. Universe. Del directed a very successful production of One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest at Teatr Nowy in Poznan, Poland, and he has acted and directed at theaters in Atlanta, New York, London, Paris, Lorient, Belgrade and Amsterdam. Del is the author of several plays and has received numerous awards.

COMPANY | CYRIL BRODY (Assistant Director) has worked with director Eric Vigner for several years, beginning with Debrayage by Remi BIOS De Vos in Switzerland which subsequently was shown at CDDB in Lorient. An independent film director, Cyril has written and directed Le Souci and En Service, a film which won a Jury's special prize in Brive, France 2007. Currently he is working with Sylvie Encrive on a new piece titled A moi-meme pour plus tard. His feature film, Les Petites vacances, was written for Olivier Peyon and has been at many independent film festivals since 2006.

> PASCAL NOËL (Lighting Design) began his professional lighting design with stage director Jérôme Savary at the Opéra Comique in Paris after graduate studies in math and physics. In 1999, he undertook the lighting for Sotigui Kouyaté's productions at several major national theaters including the Théâtre de Chatelet, the Théâtre des Bouffes du Nord and the Théâtre des Amandiers. Pascal regularly works with director Eric Vigner, lighting his productions of Beaumarchais' Barber of Seville and the contemporary playwright Remi de Vox' Debrayage. Other directors for whom Pascal has designed the lighting include Antoine Bourseiller, Nicolas Briançon, Nanou Garcia, Claude Confortès, Jacque Coutureau and Daniel Mermet. Pascal's expertise also extends to the realm of dance. He created the lighting for Sylvie Guillem's Gisèle at the Scala in Milan and the Royal Opéra House in London and for choreographer Olivier Chanut's creations at the Opera du Rhin and the Théâtre de l'Octogone.

> **OTHELLO VILGARD (Sound Design)** is a film maker and a photographer. He teaches experimental cinema at the University of Paris X-Nanterre. He is also in charge of Etna, a structure dedicated to experimental cinema, and takes part to a number of events related to this discipline (symposiums, conferences, festivals, etc.). Most of the experimental movies he has directed (such as *High*, *Lightning* and *Terrae*) are rhythmic compositions made of restricted visual elements. Since he met French stage director Eric Vigner in 2004, he has started working for theater and was associated to the director's artistic work. He has director that the director's artistic work. rected films from Savannah Bay and Pluie d'été à Hiroshima by Marquerite Duras and Où boivent les vaches by Roland Dubillard. He has been in charge of sound design for Eric Vigner's last creations including *Jusqu'à* ce que la mort nous sépare (performed at Théâtre du Rond-Point, Paris) and *Débrayage* by Remi De Vos. He has been an associated artist to CDDB-Théâtre de Lorient since 2006.


