Indian theatre today is a manifestation of

multiple realities. Practiced in a variety of languages, idioms and styles, young as well as seasoned directors create startling and out-of-the-box mis-en-scenes in an attempt to capture the texture and pulse of our complex and multilayered experiences and perceptions.

Just like the cities we live in that have no center or periphery, no borders that demarcate the urban from the countryside, where one extends into the other, coagulating into an endless, amorphous continuum, the theatre movement too can no longer be categorized into neat compartments of the 'traditional' and the 'modern'.

A global phenomenon not restricted to Indian theatre alone, one increasingly observes that international offerings also showcase an exciting spillover between mediums like dance and theatre, theatre and cinema/video technology, etc., as well as cross-cultural encounters, both within the divergent cultural traditions of the same country, as well as in the shape of international co-productions. It is not unusual to see actors within the same company hail from a variety of countries, or productions which may have a foreign team of director/designers/musicians. So, a Shakespeare play can be enacted by Indian actors, directed by an Uzbeki director, with music by a Japanese composer! Each artist brings to the production his/her own cultural sensibility... making the rehearsal process the site for inter-cultural negotiations to occur.

In such a scenario where 'hybridity' rather than 'cultural authenticity' has become the norm, it has become necessary to find new parameters of appreciating contemporary theatre as practiced today.


As we approach the 150th anniversary of Rabindranath Tagore, theatre director Neelam Man Singh Chowdhry initiates the celebrations with Stree-r Patra (A Wife's Letter), while Suman Mukhopadyay directs a powerful new version of Bisarjan.

Three original scripts include Lushin Dubey's Salaam India based on Pawan Verma's Being Indian (Delhi), Khatijabai of Karmali Terrace, a solo piece directed by Quasar Padamsee, (Mumbai) and Sunil Shanbag's Dreams of Taleem (Mumbai) while Maya Krishna Rao and Vageesh Kumar Singh present short stories by Nigerian writers as solo pieces.

Two post-modern pieces by young directors Zuleikha Chaudhari, Some Stage Directions from John Gabriel Borkman, and Sagara Kanyaka (Lady from the Sea) directed by Jyothish M.G., provide us with contemporary takes on Henrik Ibsen.

In the dance/theatre category newcomer Preethi Atreya presents an original piece Sweet Sorrow, while Navtej Johar brings us Grey is also a Colour. Significant offerings from Bengal include Tritiyo Anko Oteob with Soumitra Chatterjee, Aguner Barnomala presented by Drishyapat, Jaan-e-Kalkatta by Paikpara Akhor, and Madhabi from Nandidikar.

Smaller packages from NSD include two Repertory productions, Begum ka Takiya by Ranjit Kapoor and Little Big Tragedies by Ovlyakuli Khodjakuli; while the NSD students present five of their diploma productions.



International

At the forefront of the international section this year we have a focus on contemporary French theatre. The classic opera by Beaumarchais, The Barber of Seville, in a spectacular production by Theatre de L' Orient of Brittany, France, and, and National Theatre of Tirana, Albania, has a French director, Eric Vigner, directing a group of Albanian actors. Also from France are In Vivo, a dance piece, presented by Compagnie S'poart, a mime performance called Silent Words by Laurent Decol, and a photographic exhibition of the Footsbarn Theatre.

Another rare package is from Latin America where we have the opportunity to see contemporary work with Santa Maria de Iquique: Revenge of Ramon, Ramon from Chile, En un Sol Amarillo (In a Yellow Sun: Memories of an Earthquake) from Bolivia and Muare from Argentina.

Tara Arts of the UK, set up to give voice to the diasproic experience, along with Lucid Arts, will be showcased at our festival for the first time with Farrukh Dhondy's Miranda by Jatinder Verma.

The section of international dance theatre /choreographic pieces includes the

work of Nora Amin from Egypt with My County, Life for Remembrance and The Quest, Wendy Jehlen from USA with He who Burns and Forest,

Germany brings What Happened? The 80*81 Findings, while Poland presents Songs of Euripides, and from Serbia we have Brecht-Hardcore Machine, based on Bertolt Brecht's Buckover Elegies.

The SAARC countries present Khwabon ke Musafir directed by Zia Mohyuddin, and Dara by Shahid Nadeem from Pakistan; a lyrical production of Brecht's The Caucasian Chalk Circle is brought to us by Aarohan Company from Nepal; we have Aroj Charitammrito by Tariq Anam Khanfrom Bangladesh; Makarakshaya - The Dragon from Sri Lanka; and Stones and Mirrors by Monireh Hashmi from Afghanistan.

Wrap-Around Events

A series of wrap around programmes around the Festival include talks and interactive sessions with Directors/Designers on Performance Language/Scenography/Light Design.

- Three photographic exhibitions include Abhi-Vyakti, a photographic exhibition celebrating the actor; working methodologies of Asian theatre schools (part of Asia-Pacific workshop); and an exhibition on the Footsbarn Company, France.
- Asia Pacific Drama Schools' Workshop and Festival.
- The other programmes include The Garbage Project, Social Gaming, a special duet of dance and music by Min Tanaka and Aki Takahashi, amongst others.
